The Investiture of Presiding Bishop-elect Sean Rowe Nov. 2, 2024



"MINISTER'S MUSINGS"

Jesus' Tears

This Sunday's gospel reading comes from John 11:32-44, the story of Jesus raising Lazarus from the grave. On All Saints Sunday, we celebrate the lives of those we love and see no more because we know they are with us even when our human eyes block them from view. It is a comfort to recall that those in our communion of saints and souls surround us and pray with us. But for those who have felt the loss of a loved one, that comfort holds hands with our grief. The two are inseparable.

Ambivalence, the experience of feeling conflicting emotions simultaneously, can be exhausting. It's a relief to know Jesus, the incarnate God, experienced this complex part of being a human person too. Because Jesus felt the pain of grief, we can find comfort in his solidarity with our humanity.

When this passage speaks of Jesus weeping, it uses a Hebrew word specific to physical tears. It isn't noting the sound of his cries, but the wet drops coming from his eyes. Did you know that there are different types of tears? Each type has a different biological composition, containing different hormones and proteins. Emotional tears, the kind produced in response to strong emotion, contain the highest levels of neurotransmitters and toxins. Tears are the way our bodies cleanse themselves from the poisons that accumulate inside us from stressful and painful experiences.

Jesus could have handled this situation with Lazarus in a number of different ways which would have precluded his own pain, but he didn't. When he arrived to find his friends grieving, he didn't push away their grief or avoid his own. Instead, "he was greatly disturbed in spirit and deeply moved." Jesus' body entered into the human experience of grief. His intellect knew he would raise Lazarus, he even understood the reality of Lazarus' life beyond the grave. And yet, Jesus' human self both felt and expressed the pain of loss.

The feast of All Saints is a joyful celebration! And... if we also feel the grief of loss, hot tears, and heavy hearts, we are in good company. Jesus and our beloved communion of saints join us in experiencing the complex stew of the human heart. Thanks be to God for his attention to BOTH our joys and our sorrows! And thanks be to God that one day all our tears will be forever wiped away.
