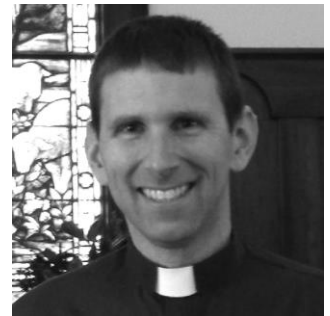

Daughters of the King

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

Years ago, on internship at a large Episcopal church in Dallas, I was introduced to a woman who was the head of the local chapter of a church organization that I had never heard of before. She was, I could tell, a very spiritual woman. It was the sort of thing that just radiated off of her. It wasn't like there was anything visibly special about her, there were no visible markers, yet her demeanor, I sensed, was different. She was very peaceful, yet focused. The only visible sign that stood out to me was the silver cross around her neck, which was inscribed with the letters "DOK"—The Daughters of the King.



Soon thereafter I came to learn about the Daughters of the King and of their importance to the church. The DOK, I learned, is a religious order that was started in the 19th century for Episcopal women who desire a closer walk with the Lord. The women who are a part of it are not nuns and they don't cloister themselves away from the world. But they do commit to devote themselves to support each other and to live under the rule of the DOK. A "rule" in this sense is a structured discipline of life and prayer that Christians follow to grow deeper and live out their faith.

More than an ECW, the Daughters of the King have a clearly defined mission—"to extend Christ's Kingdom through Prayer, Service and Evangelism"—and they live that mission out in their everyday life and in the ministries of the church. Indeed, in every parish I have known which has had a chapter of the DOK, the Daughters constitute the backbone of the church, praying and serving often behind the scenes and with no concern for accolades but indispensably.

A few months ago, Briarley Rogers shared with me that she had attended a meeting of the DOK at St. Stephen's Episcopal Church in Culpeper. When others heard about the meeting, several women expressed an interest in knowing more about it. So we have arranged for a member of the DOK chapter at St. Stephen's to come to

Piedmont on Saturday, June 9, to share about the organization and to answer any questions that some may have.

Our hope is to establish our own chapter here at Piedmont, and so wish to invite any woman, from age 7 to age 107, to attend this meeting and learn more about the DOK and its mission. If you are interested, please contact Briarley Rogers, Vickie Parker or Deacon Kathryn Thomas. To have a chapter of the DOK at Piedmont would be a great blessing not to those who would be a part of it, but to the larger parish as well. Please prayerfully consider if this might be something that God is inviting you to.

In Shepherd's Way we have a work for Ordinary Time , the Pearl of Great Price, based on Matthew 13: 45-46, "The kingdom of heaven is like a merchant searching for fine pearls. When he finds a pearl of great price he goes and sells all he has and buys it."

And we are not settling for the ordinary at Piedmont; we are seeing the blessings; we are seeing God working in the here and now;

Blessings in seeing four children, who are forming community in a home new to them all, having the recreation of Belle Meade, generously outfitted and sent by the love of Christ at Piedmont.

Blessings in generous offerings of food and supplies for the MESA Food Pantry;

Blessings in seeing the gift of The Order of the Daughters of the King as we women meet to discern if God is calling us to from a chapter here, to immerse ourselves more deeply in a covenant with God to pray and study His Word.
