Pentecost Sunday

This Sunday we will celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit through the New Testament reading in Acts 2:1-21 which recounts the phenomena of all hearing their own language. The congregation will read this passage in unison, and anyone who could read the passage in another language will add to the celebration. Minister's Musings

Pentecost Prayers

This Sunday much of the assembly will be adorned in red garments to commemorate the Holy Spirit's descent in flaming tongues of fire. The Day of Pentecost is the initiation of the longest season on the liturgical calendar, the season of Pentecost, also called "ordinary time". The term "ordinary" refers to the numbering of the Sundays of Pentecost, from the Latin "ordinalis". It is no indication that the content of summer services is ordinary. In fact, the opposite is true. The readings and themes of this season highlight the miraculous work of God through the efficacy of the Holy Spirit, and that is never ordinary!

Beginning this Sunday our liturgy will change once more to reflect the themes of the season. Now that Easter season is complete, we will return to our practice of making weekly common confession. The Prayers of the People will once again be lay-led to remind each of us of our participation in God's work through prayer. We are also switching to Eucharistic Prayer C. Like the themes of the Pentecost readings, this prayer highlights the activity of the Holy Spirit through God in creation, the words and acts of the patriarchs and prophets, and the ongoing activity of the Spirit through us today. It uses powerful images and seeks to provoke our imaginations.

I confess to being a person who finds my hands and feet more easily stirred to action when my heart and mind are first awakened. Hearing things in a new way helps ignite this within me and so I enjoy liturgical changes. I am curious to hear how this new liturgical structure strikes our community. When I was in seminary, Prayer C gained the colloquial title of "The Star Wars Prayer". I have colleagues who claim this as their most beloved prayer and others who refuse to use it because they find it distasteful. In my opinion, the fact that it gains a strong reaction makes it that much more valuable. After all, emotional responses are one way to keep our minds stimulated. As always, I invite all


input and look forward to continuing to craft our liturgy ("the work of the people") together in the future. I pray that what we do on Sundays always positions us for active service to God throughout the rest of the week.

Vestry Report

Dear Members of Piedmont:

Piedmont's financial report for the first 4 months of 2025 is posted on the parish house bulletin board. The church income and expenses are on track for the first third of the calendar year. Thanks to the congregation for your continued generous support.

This report lists the purchase in April of a new air conditioner for the church building. While this was an unexpected expense, the vestry determined that replacement was the more practical approach than partial repair to the old unit.

Recalling the adage "when it rains, it pours" an additional building issue has come up. The parish house apartment floor sustained some water damage during the recent periods of heavy rain. Some of the flooring in the downstairs kitchen area will be replaced. The vestry is still investigating how to solve the runoff and drainage issues which will likely involve some excavation. In consultation with contractors on various options, the vestry has been advised that the deodar cedar in the front yard of the parish house is contributing to the problem. Reluctantly, the cedar tree is scheduled to be taken down on Friday, June 6. While this is a loss to our beautiful property, Piedmont's cost is limited to debris removal. The expense of taking it down will be borne by REC as their electric lines and pole are engulfed by the tree.

Please know that vestry members are available to answer questions about these projects. The next vestry meeting is June 15.


