Minister's Musings

Saint Helena's Holy Sites

May 22nd is the feast day of Saint Helena of Constantinople. Helena was the mother of Emperor Constantine, the ruler who legalized Christianity after many years of persecution directed against Christians in the Roman world. Helena converted to Christianity, some believe because of his faith, and then dedicated her life in service to the poor and infirm.

Later in her life, in 326, she took a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. While traveling, she initiated the reclamation of several Christian holy sites like the Mount of Olives and the site of Jesus' crucifixion. Several sites had to have pagan temples removed first and then she had basilicas erected in their place. One of the most significant acts of her life was during her travels when she is said to have found the cross and the nails of Jesus' crucifixion. Their authenticity was verified when contact with them was shown to have miraculous healing power. Her legacy persists to this day as the holy sites remain centers of Christian worship and the relics she found remain housed in the Roman Basilica of the Holy Cross in Jerusalem.

Helena was given the title "Protector of the Holy Places" because of the way she hunted them down and venerated them in perpetuity. I happen to love

visiting and praying in ancient holy sites. There is something powerful about spaces bathed in the prayers of centuries of worshipers! I also think it is important to remind ourselves daily that God is not confined to temples erected by human hands. In fact, we ourselves are temples of God and God's Spirit dwells within US! To honor Helena's legacy in today's world, we can make it our quest to track down the people in whom God's Spirit seems evident and celebrate that. Additionally, we can remind one another, when we witness flagging strength or depressed spirits, that we are indeed temples of the Most High God. Our participation in the work of God can join Helena's labors by protecting the holy places in the hearts and lives of the people of God so that together WE can be the Church of God.
