Minister's Musings

God, Our Mother

Throughout history, God has been labeled with male pronouns and comfortably called "father". In modern times, scholars and theologians have pushed back against that patriarchal assumption by claiming female pronouns for God and using feminine imagery to describe the divine. While this may feel unconventional to some, the Bible is full of maternal imagery for God. God is likened to one who labors and gives birth, offering the comforting and sustenance of her breast. She is described as a mother hen, bear, and bird who nurtures and comforts with that same tenderness. Feminism is not the initiator of these images but may have helped to recenter them in the modern imagination. But contemporary voices are not the only ones who have experienced or expressed God in this way.

Julian of Norwich is one of the most significant early authors to highlight maternal imagery for God. Thursday, May 8th, is Julian's feast day. She lived in England at the beginning of the fifteenth century as an anchoress. Anchoresses were women who lived so completely devoted to God that they were declared dead, stripped of their names (Julian is the name of her church), and sealed inside a windowed cell attached to the church. They spent their lives in prayer, meditation, and offered counsel to those who came in need. Julian suffered a terrible illness that brought her to the edge of death where she was administered last rights. At that moment, she had a vision of the passion of Christ whose love changed her life. She recovered her health and wrote about her experience in *Revelations of Divine Love*, which was not published until 250 years after her death. In *Revelations*, she described a God who "is nearer to us than our own soul". The love she expressed describing God was full of female, maternal images.

This Sunday is the celebration of Mother's Day. As we celebrate the blessing of earthly mothers, reimagining God in this context may offer us a new glimpse into Christ's passion and move our hearts to respond in new ways. Let us consider Julian's own words, "Our true mother, Jesus, he who is all love, bears us into joy and eternal life. . .. He sustains us within himself in love and was in labor for the full time until he suffered the sharpest pangs and the most grievous suffering that ever were or shall be, and at the last he died. . .. Even this could not fully satisfy his marvelous love; and that he showed in these high surpassing words of love, 'If I could suffer more, I would suffer more."

-Rev. Becki (As an aside, Julian was a lover of cats, is considered the patron saint of cats....and who doesn't love her for that?!)

Collect: Triune God, Father and Mother to us all, who showed your servant Julian revelations of your nurturing and sustaining love: Move our hearts, like hers, to seek you above all things, for in giving us yourself you give us all. Amen
